In 1963, the First Annual Live Nativity Scene was presented on the church lot on Curtis Street. This tradition has continued for 16 consecutive years, and is eagerly anticipated by both church members and members of the community.

In 1973, ground was broken for the Educational Annex. The building contains six classrooms, a fellowship hall, kitchen, separate nursery facilities for infants and toddlers, storage rooms and the minister's study. Also, the Library and Museum in Hobby Hall was furnished at time.

Construction of the parsonage began in November of 1978 and was completed in January, 1979. Another milestone passed during this time was the completion of payments on the original building and sanctuary in December of 1978. At this time, the only debt outstanding on buildings is for our parsonage.
